	Nature/Ecology	Embrace Nature and STEM with this Area. Envi-Sci, Geology, Outdoor Ethics, World Conservation Awards, Astronomy and more...
	Shooting Sports	We offer Rifle Shooting at Camp Alpine. Working at the range requires mature, observant and safety-orientated staff
	Summit	Our adventure program takes scouts hiking and camping in the alps, rafting and Canyoning, and exploring around Kandersteg. 18+
