Annual Program Planning

- ❖ Have a date set in May, at the End Of The Program Year to plan forward.
 - ➤ Key events over the upcoming 12 months
 - Estimated cost/duration/location
 - Local (school/host nation/Troop), District, Council events deconflicted?
 - Private Organization Requirements fulfilled? When?
 - Local, District, Council contact lists updated?
 - Key roles filled or ready for transition
 - Who's moving out/in?
 - Each den/pack/troop 2-deep?
 - > Financial Planning
 - What was spent last year? How much will be spent this year?
 - Advancements and Awards Inventory





Monthly Planning

- ★ Have it on the calendar.
- ★ Invite families.
- ★ Invite feedback.
- * Review recent events.
- Discuss details of upcoming events (current month and upcoming month)
- ★ Review financial picture.
- ★ Track deadlines for BSA, your private organization office, fundraisers, insurance, etc.
- ★ Share the meeting notes to keep leaders and/or families informed.





Monthly Planning - Big Picture

- ★ What do you need to think about in the fall that will help you be ready for the winter?
 - Pinewood Derby Cars? PWD materials/decorations/awards?
 - O Blue & Gold decorations/theme?
 - AOL gifts/certificates/emblems?
 - Troop shoulder loops/neckerchiefs/slides/handbooks for incoming Scouts?

- ★ What do you need to think about in the spring that will help you in the fall?
- ★ What do you need to think about in the winter that will help you in the spring?





Monthly Planning Larger Picture

- ➤ Keep in mind National, Council, District, & Special Scouting events when communicating plans with families.
- > Keep in mind families in multiple units They can't be two places at once.
- Recognition: Cubs and Scouts should be regularly recognized/awarded in a timely manner.
- Recognition: Adults should be recognized for what they have earned in front of their units.
- Recognition: Volunteers should be recognized for their efforts in front of their units.





Awards and Insignia

- Have a system and plan in place for record keeping (Scoutbook)
- Utilize the system consistently
- > Have a plan for ordering awards and insignia
- > Have a plan for organization and storage of awards and insignia
- Have a plan and time regularly and consistently throughout the year to recognize and award Cubs/Scouts for their achievements
- > Same goes for uniforms Official and Activity
