

Safety Minutes by Jen Guth Cold Weather



Normal

Skin without cold damage.

Frostnip

Mild frostbite that irritates the skin, causing redness and a cold feeling followed by numbness.

SYMPTOMS OF FROSTBITE

- At first, cold skin and a prickling feeling Numbness
- Red, white, bluish-white or grayish-yellow skin Hard or waxy-looking skin
- Clumsiness due to joint and muscle stiffness Blistering after rewarming, in severe cases

Superficial frostbite

Skin feels warm, a sign of serious skin involvement. A fluid-filled blister may appear 24 to 36 hours after rewarming the skin.

Deep frostbite

You may experience numbness. Joints or muscles may no longer work. Large blisters form 24 to 48 hours after rewarming. Afterward, the area turns black and hard.

Always dress in layers when out

BASE LAYER COID

Warmth/ Moisture Control

Regulates body warmth and moves perspiration away from body



Also known as "long underwear/ johns" and usually made of synthetic material. Available in lightweight, middleweight and heavyweight, depending on the season. We recommend one lightweight and one heavyweight top and lower options for the Dayara trek. This will allow you more choice, depending on the prevalent conditions.

MIDDLE LAYERS

The Mid layers retain heat, trapping it close to the body





Fleece (synthetic wool) top and bottoms above the base layer. A puffy jacket (down or synthetic down) for insulations. Both of these are compressible and light and will easily fit into your backpack.

OUTER LAYER Weather Protection

Protects from harsh weather conditions such as Snow, Rain, Sleet, Hail





Commonly known as wind shell jackets, these can be worn above your mid layers and insulate your body as well as breathe well during hiking. On top of this we suggest a waterproof shell. which will actually keep you dry when it snows (snow quickly melts when coming into contact with the body).





Cosy: our Trupphaus


Our Trupphaus is ideal for groups of guests wanting to live and work intensively and undisturbed for a few days.

The National Eagle Scout Committee of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) invites all BSA Eagle Scouts living in the Transatlantic Council to apply for its annual Arthur M. & Berdena King Eagle Scout Contest.

The contest requires you to provide three items:

- 1 a list of your Scouting, school and community activities
- 2 a patriotic essay of no more than 500 words
- 3 a four-generation ancestor chart

You can find the necessary forms by going to the contest page on the SAR website (<u>bit.ly/SAR-King-Contest</u>) and scrolling down to Contest Resources.

Eagles living in the Transatlantic Council enter the USA national contest by applying directly to the National SAR Eagle Scout Committee. From the applications received, this committee will select the overseas candidates to for ward to the national American contest. To be eligible for consideration, the National SAR Eagle Scout Committee must receive an application by midnight, Central European Time, December 31. Winners will be announced in March.

AWARDS for US NATIONAL WINNERS

Last year more than fifteen prizes were awarded. The top three prizes this year are:

First Place	\$10,000
Second Place	\$6,000
Third Place	\$4,000

SPECIAL AWARD for GERMANY

Eagle Scouts living in Germany will also be automatically entered into the additional contest sponsored by the Germany Society of the SAR. The top entrant in this contest will receive a prize of \$500.




