

TAC 2022 HIGHLIGHTS

Unparalleled Scouting

In 2020: "TAC Game Plan" strategic plan adopted, with 5 key Aims: Geography, Inclusivity, Sustainability, Normandy, and Generosity

In 2021: "TAC 75x75" roadmap adopted, targeting specific achievements in each of those Aims in each year to our 75th anniversary in 2025

Game Plan Highlights in 2022

Geography

Serving youth in 52 countries, and growing, throughout Europe, the Middle East, Central Asia, and Africa

Council adventure camp in Africa (Camp Kenya) delivered for the first time ever, with Scouts and Scouters from 14 countries on 4 continents, including 7 US states

Council summer camps in the Swiss Alps (Camp Alpine) and on the Croatian Coast (Camp Avantura BSA), delivered for the first time in 3 years

3300 total youth and adult registrants in council camps

National leadership training programs for youth (NYLT) and adults (Wood Badge) held in Germany

Cub Scout camps in 4 locations in Germany and Italy District camporees in 4 locations in UK, Belgium and Germany

Council Scouters Annual Conference and Annual General Meeting held in Rome

Inclusivity

19 female Eagle Scout ranks awarded to date

Girls increase to approx 18% of youth membership (above BSA average). All TAC Cub Packs now welcome girls. 1/3 of TAC Scouts BSA Troops are now girl troops.

Over 1,000 new youth recruited in Fall 2022

Sustainability

TAC is now a carbon neutral BSA council – probably the first ever

500 trees planted from 2020 through direct action by TAC families





Journey to Sustainability unit scorecard launched Sustainability Coordinator unit leadership position created

Sustainability Challenge for all youth and families created in new 2-level format

Normandy

2700 participants in our Normandy Camporee in April 2022, despite ongoing pandemic travel hurdles

New app created to enrich participant experience. Memorial services held to honor Americans, British, French and Germans, supporting Scout Messengers of Peace global initiative. Large contingent of French Scouts fully incorporated into the event.

Generosity

Annual Friends of Scouting fundraising campaign (Dec 2021 – Feb 2022) raised over \$290,000. Normandy donor reception raised over \$80,000.

Endowment fund contributions received from 30 individuals 1950 Society launched to welcome broad participation in endowment fund

Other Highlights

113 Eagle ranks and 4172 merit badges awarded in Scouts BSA
112 Arrow of Light ranks and 1435 total ranks awarded in Cub Scouts
10 ranks awarded in Sea Scouts, and 10 in Venturing

TAC received a license to deliver the prestigious Duke of Edinburgh International Award in its service area

Mobile Trading Post and council outreach visited 15 communities and events in 5 countries
